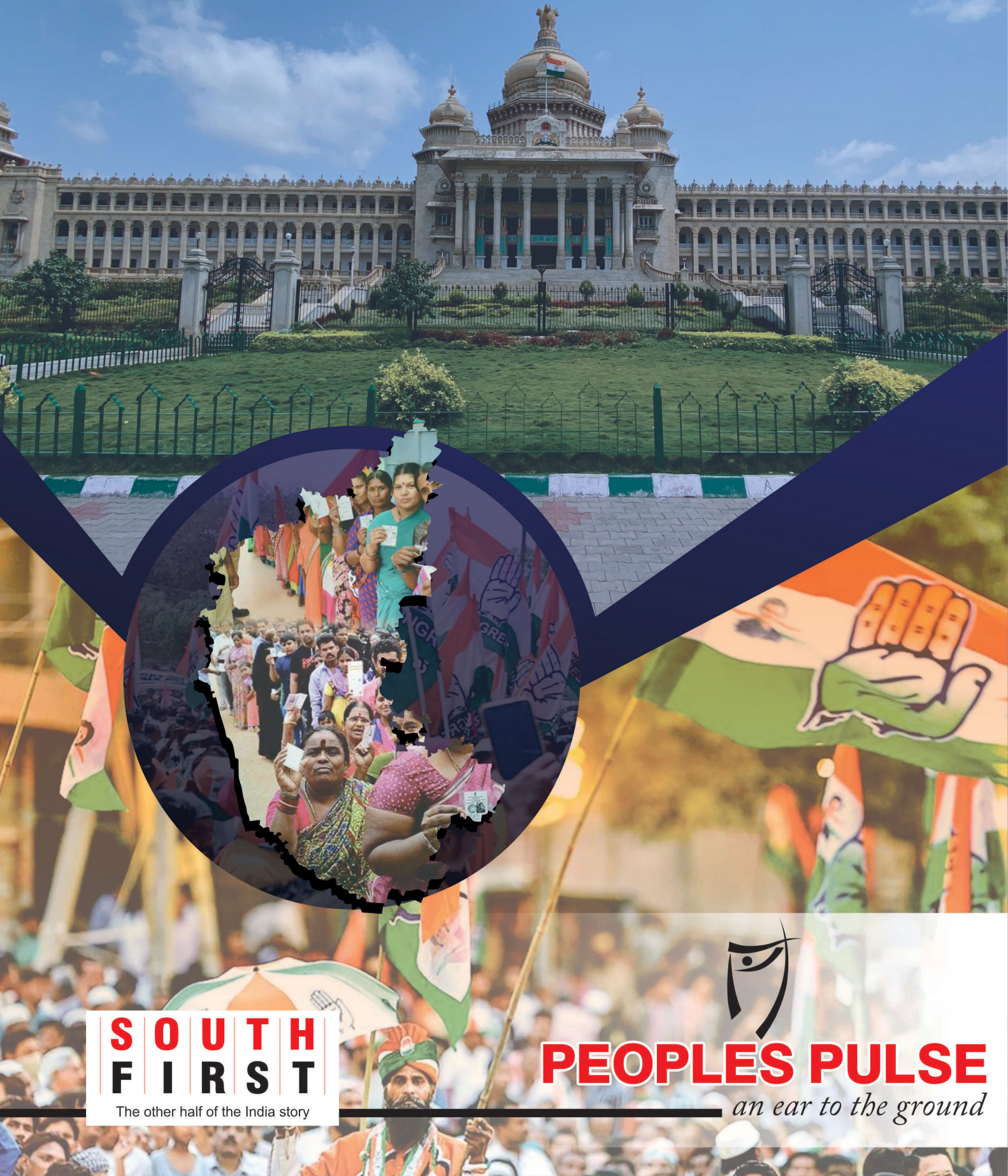

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Slight Edge for Congress in Karnataka

By all indications a few days ahead of polls, it could be a Congress led government in Karnataka post May 13. Barring last minute shift in voters' mood, which appears unlikely, the Congress is all set to cross the three-figure mark and may well end up with a simple majority in the 224-member Assembly, in keeping with the trend over past three decades during which no incumbent government retained power.

According to the latest pre-poll survey done by research organisation, **People's Pulse**, in association with **South First**, a digital news platform, the INC is expected to win **105-117** seats, the BJP **81-93** and the JD (S) **24-29**. Though the BJP vote share remains more or less constant at **36** per cent as it was in the last election, the Congress is gaining three per cent, resulting in higher number of votes.

Congress is enjoying the slight edge in all parameters of the Pre-Poll survey conducted by Peoples Pulse research organisation. The survey showed that the Congress is leading over the other parties uniformly on all parameters, namely, development, welfare, community preference, C.M choice, party preference, across age and gender. Congress has an edge over its main rival BJP in all the regions except coastal Karnataka.

According to Pre-Poll survey conducted by Peoples Pulse research Organization, the Congress vote share would move from **38.14** percent in 2018 to **41.4** percent. The ruling BJP party is holding its ground. In 2018 it got a vote share **36.35** percent in the Pre-Poll now it is getting 36 percent, which is a loss of hair breadth **0.3** percent. The JD(S) the King maker in 2018 elections would get **16** percent now, which is **2.3** percent down from what it got in 2018 elections.

For any survey a margin of error is plus or minus two percent. The survey did not factor the last two days of campaign and therefore could not assess the last minute swing in favour of or against any of the main parties.

The Pre-Poll survey was commissioned by news website, **“South First”** and was conducted from **1st May to 5th May 2023** by Peoples Pulse research Organization. Pre-Poll survey Report was compiled by **Mr.R.Dileep Reddy**, Director Peoples Pulse research Organization.

People’s Pulse conducted a Pre-Poll Survey in **56** Assembly segments selected on the basis of Probability proportional Methodology (PPS). Three polling stations selected from each Assembly segment. In each polling station **20** samples were collected. A total of **3360** samples were chosen such that the sample reflects the situation on the ground in terms of caste, religion and age. Gender was given equal representation.

It is pertinent to mention that Peoples Pulse conducted First Pre-Poll survey in Karnataka from **22nd to 31 December 2022**. The Second Pre-Poll survey was conducted from **25th March to 10th April 2023**. The Third and Final Pre-Poll survey was conducted after with drawl of nomination from **1st May to 5th May 2023**.

When respondents were asked who they preferred as the next Chief Minister Mr. Siddaramaiah Former Chief Minister, stood tall with **42** percent of the voters preferring him. Followed by the present CM, Mr Basavaraj Bommai with **24** percent, Former Chief Minister Mr Kumaraswamy with **17** percent, Former chief Minister B. Yediyurappa came with **14** percent and DK. Shivakumar with **3** percent.

When which party asked is better for the Development of Karnataka **46** percent said it was the Congress, BJP **34** percent and JD(S) **14** percent.

When asked should BJP Government will be given another chance **53** percent said No, **41** percent said Yes, Can't say **6** percent.

The last Karnataka Pre-poll survey by People's Pulse was conducted in April. Since then, significant changes have taken place in the political landscape of the state.

- The three major parties experienced a high level of defections and rebellions after the announcement of tickets.
- The release of the parties' manifestos has generated a lot of controversies.
- Moreover, the official campaign has commenced, star campaigner rallies have taken place, and statements by major parties have led to more controversies and counter-campaigns.

Change in Voting preference of major communities: According to the results of this Pre-Poll survey, all major political parties are maintaining their vote banks across various communities, with minor changes observed. For instance, BJP continues to have the support of Lingayats, Nayaka ST, and SC left, while JD(S) holds Vokkaligas, and INC is supported by Kurubas, other OBCs, SC Right, and Muslims.

However, depending on the candidates and local dynamics, minor shifts are occurring even within these communities. Nevertheless, this round of survey has also revealed changes in the voting preferences of some communities. For instance, Bhovis, who belong to the touchable SC caste and have been leaning towards BJP until recently, are now shifting their allegiance to Congress. Similarly, Muslim voters in South Karnataka are decisively moving away from JD S and shifting their support to INC.

Current political issues: The survey has identified several critical issues that are at the forefront of the voters, including:

- a. **Communal Polarisation:** BJP is attempting to polarise communities by focusing on the banning of Bajrang Dal and the recently released movie The Kerala Story. While BJP leaders have been aggressive in campaigning on these issues, they are not impacting voters' decisions, except in Coastal Karnataka. However, due to the ban of Bajrang Dal, BJP is successfully consolidating its traditional voter base.
- b. **Price Rise:** The rise in gas cylinder prices is a significant issue for the voters, with many expressing their concerns about it.
- c. **Unemployment:** The youth are concerned about the issue of unemployment, but their political preferences are primarily based on caste lines. For instance, Lingayat, Maratha, and ST-Nayaka youth tend to favour BJP, while Kuruba, Muslim, and SC (Right) youth are inclined towards INC, and Vokkaliga youth tend to prefer JD(S).
- d. **Corruption:** While INC is aggressively raising the issue of corruption, and the term '40% Sarkara' is a polarising term in the state, voters are not changing their voting behaviour on the basis of the corruption issue.

- e. **Agrarian Distress:** Farmers are dissatisfied with the incumbent government's handling of the MSP and compensation for crop losses. They may vote for INC and JD(S) as they feel that BJP has done nothing for them.
- f. **Kannada Pride:** Kannada pride is an issue in Southern Karnataka but not in North Karnataka. However, it is not impacting the voting pattern.
- g. **Inner Party Rivalry:** This is an essential issue in the state, as both INC and BJP are struggling due to disgruntled leaders who are sabotaging the prospects of official party candidates.
- h. **INC Guarantee Promises:** INC's promises are gaining traction among the people. INC may gain additional votes from the poor, women, and rural populations because of Grih Laxmi, Grih Jyoti, Anna Bhagya, Yuva Nidhi and Free Bus services to women.

Change in terms of voting preference of different Classes and Gender:

In this round of pre-poll survey, a significant finding was the extent of voting preference based on class and gender. It was observed that across communities, the poor and women are dissatisfied with the current government due to several issues, with price rise and joblessness being the major concerns. Unlike the BJP government in Uttar Pradesh, the Karnataka BJP government has failed to establish a committed group of beneficiaries of the government's social welfare schemes who would support the party despite challenges.

Due to these reasons, the BJP is expected to perform poorly among this section of voters. Although HD Kumaraswamy was appreciated for his pro-people work, most voters in this section expressed a preference for the Indian National Congress (INC) party.

Change in party preference: In comparing the findings of this round with those of the previous round, we have identified three major trends.

- a. Firstly, while a significant number of respondents still believe that a *Sammishra Sarkara* (alliance government, meaning hung house) is likely, the number of respondents who believe that the Indian National Congress (INC) will secure a majority has increased significantly. Conversely, the number of respondents who believe that the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) will secure a majority has decreased.
- b. Secondly, the number of respondents who prefer to vote for the INC has increased, while those who prefer the BJP and JD(S) have decreased.
- c. Finally, our analysis indicates that smaller parties such as the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), KRPP (led by G. Janaradana Reddy), and other independents have limited scope, and they only have chances on around 1 to 3 seats out of 224 ACs in Karnataka.

These findings suggest that the INC has gained momentum and could potentially secure a majority in the upcoming elections. However, with a significant number of respondents still predicting a hung house, it is clear that the electoral outcome remains uncertain.

- d. **An Overview of the Campaigns of various parties:** In the current political scenario of Karnataka, the Indian National Congress (INC) is the only party that has led a sustained campaign. This is evident as all INC leaders, including the entire Gandhi family, have conducted physical rallies in the state.

The primary focus of the INC campaign is to highlight the corruption of the incumbent government, lack of development, joblessness, and price rise. The campaign is localized and concentrated on issues that are important to the people of Karnataka.

In contrast, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has faced some challenges during the campaign. While Prime Minister Modi, who is immensely popular in the state across all divisions, has conducted a record number of rallies, other BJP senior leaders have exhausted themselves in the campaign. Despite this, the BJP failed to produce a singular campaign line and changed the tone of its campaign a few times. Initially, the party focused on national issues, but it realized that those were not resonating with the voters.

The BJP then attempted to localize the issues, but the lack of support for the incumbent government forced it to change its tone again. The PM tried to corner the INC over abuse towards him, but this failed to gain any traction. Finally, the BJP resorted to the communal polarization issue, which was handed to them by the Bajrang Dal banning episode of the INC manifesto.

However, even that did not work, and they turned to the Love Jihad angle of the Kerala Story film. It is important to note that this election is highly localized, and any national issue or campaign line has failed to attract traction, similar to the recent Himachal Pradesh Assembly election.

The JD(S) has led a very localized campaign, primarily focused on south Karnataka. This strategy has helped the party to hold its ground, although it has suffered some losses.

Peoples Pulse researchers, alongside the third Pre-Poll survey, visited all the constituencies in the six regions of the state from **25th April to 5th May 2023**. To conduct a Pre-Poll Mood study in all Assembly segments to assess the voter dispensation towards the main political parties. They listed the prevailing situation in each Assembly constituency after face-to-face interviews and group discussions and then marked which party was holding the edge.

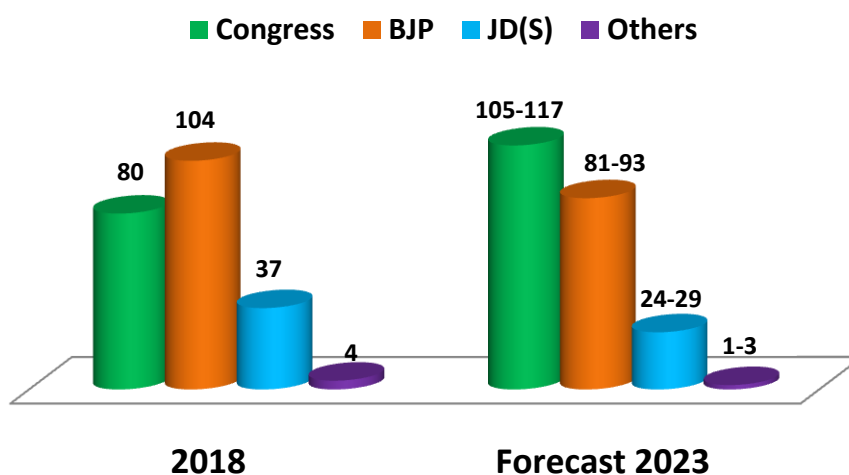

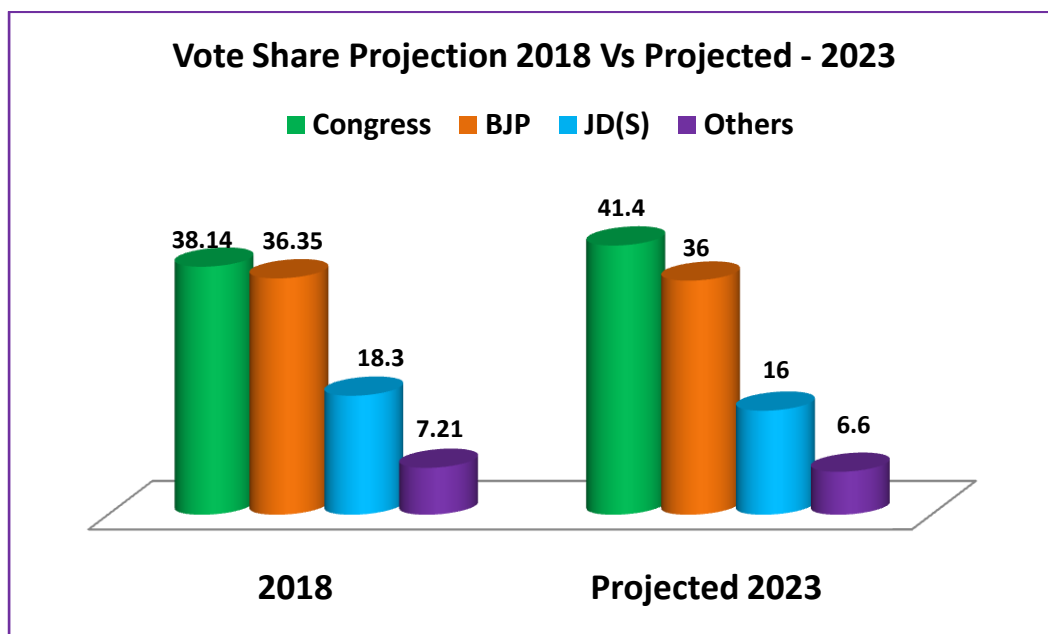
Seat Forecast – Vidhan Sabha 2023



Vote Share Projection - 2023

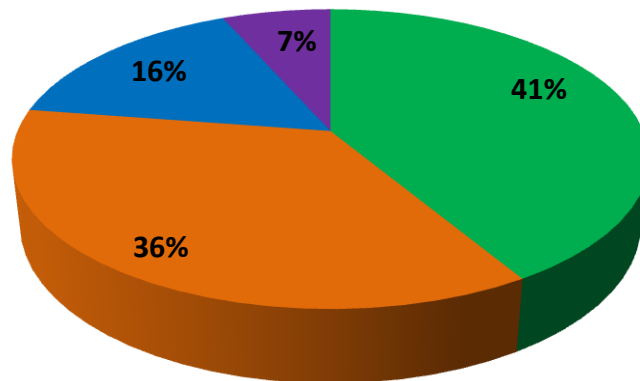

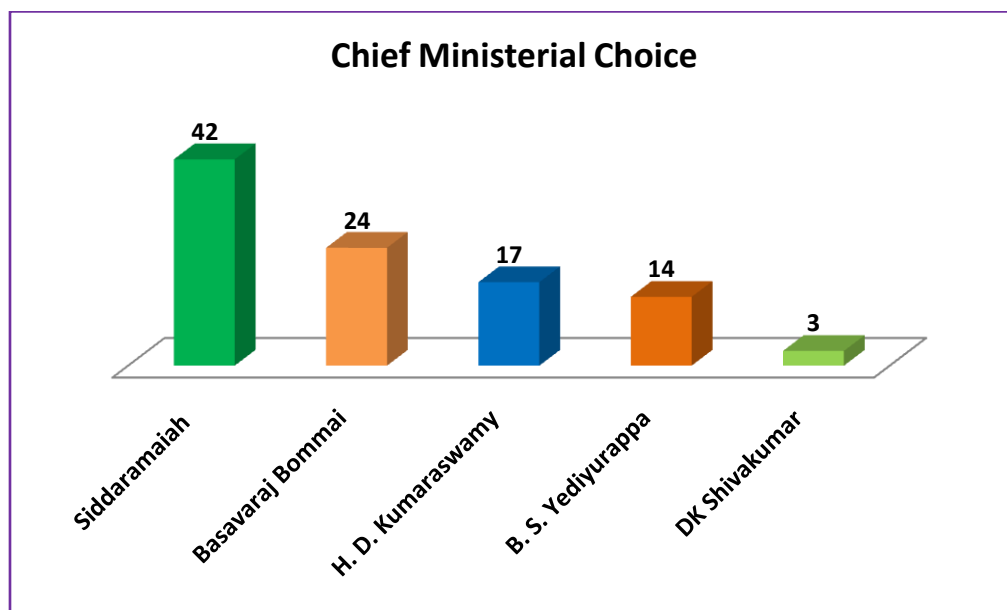
Vote Share Projection Vidhan Sabha 2023

■ Congress ■ BJP ■ JD(S) ■ Others



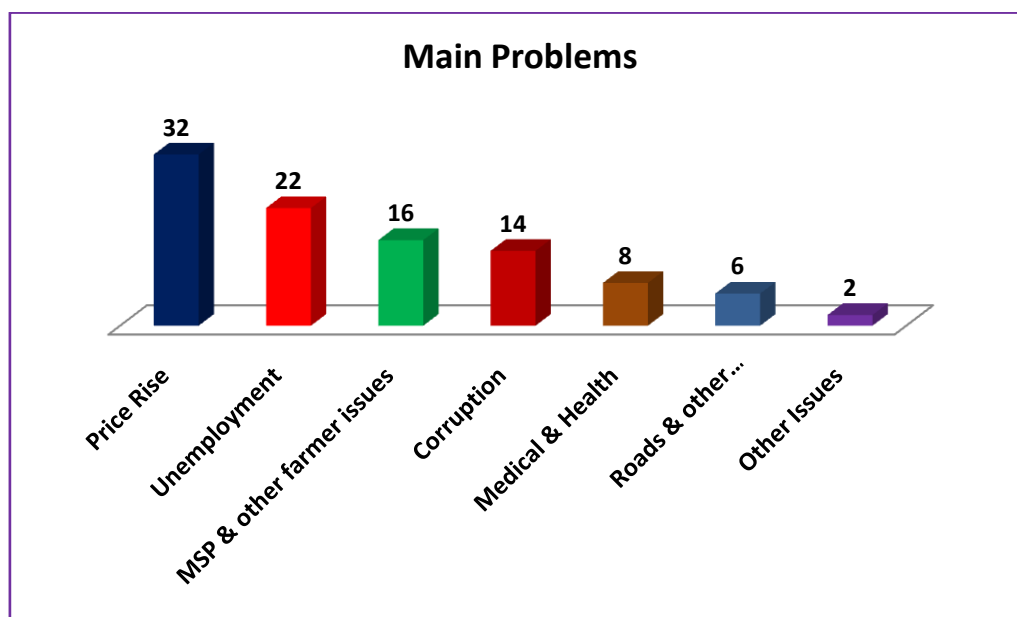

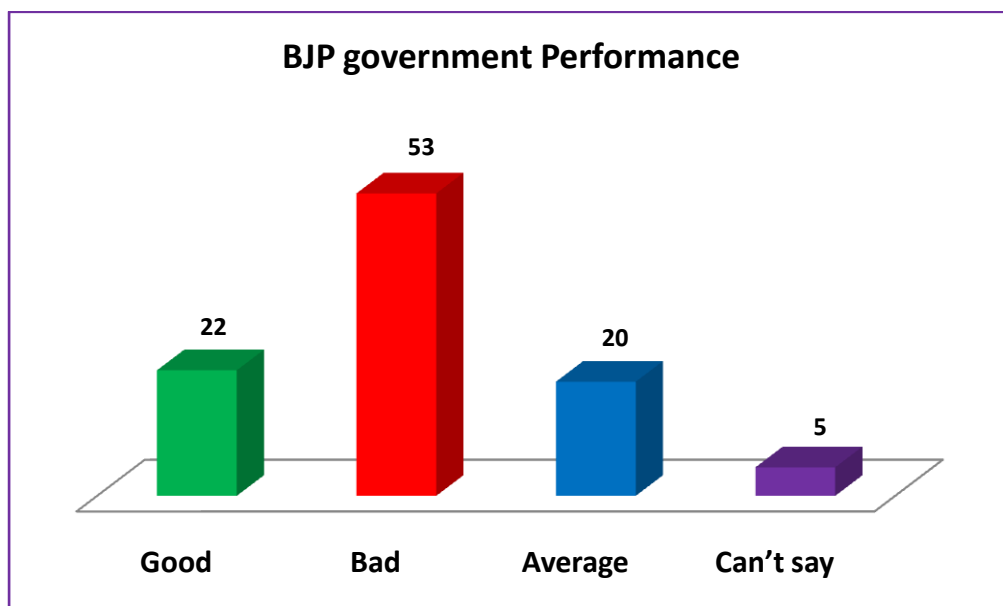

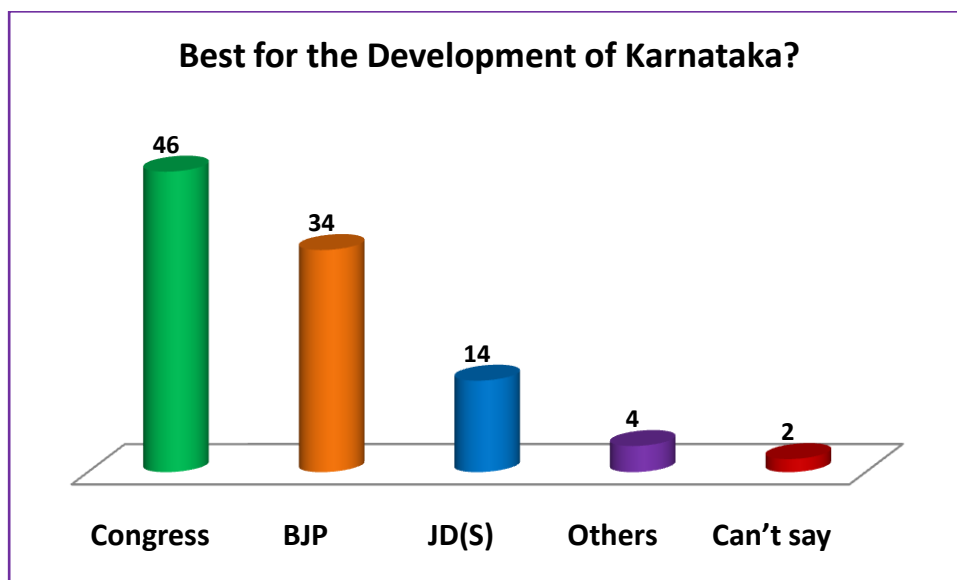

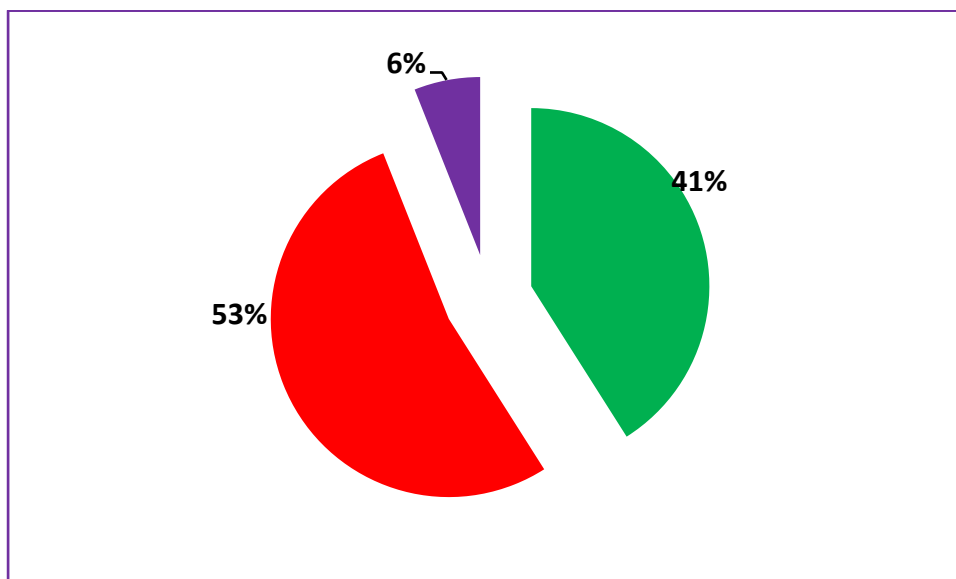
Which party is better for the Development of Karnataka?
